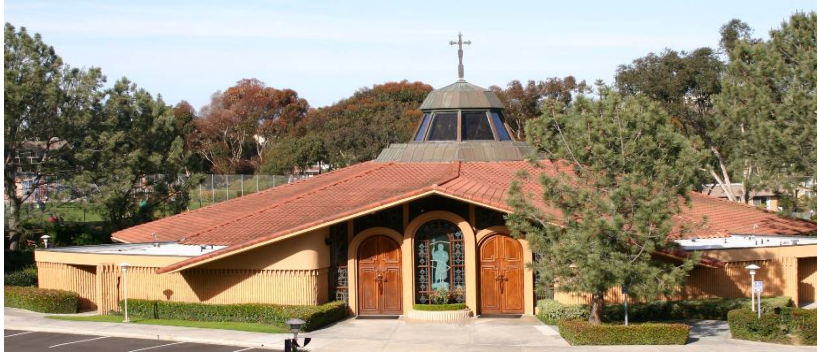

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, our Lady's greatest title. This feast is the octave of Christmas. In the modern Roman Calendar only Christmas and Easter enjoy the privilege of an octave. According to the 1962 Missal of Bl. John XXIII the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite, today is the Solemnity of Circumcision of Our Lord.

"Mary, the all-holy ever-virgin Mother of God, is the masterpiece of the mission of the Son and the Spirit in the fullness of time. For the first time in the plan of salvation and because his Spirit had prepared her, the Father found the dwelling place where his Son and his Spirit could dwell among men. In this sense the Church's Tradition has often read the most beautiful texts on wisdom in relation to Mary. Mary is acclaimed and represented in the liturgy as the "Seat of Wisdom.

## STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

It is interesting that today, a day on which we celebrate the feast of Mary, the Mother of God, we hear very little about Mary in the readings.

Mary plays a vital role in Salvation History, and today we celebrate a key part of that role. But when we reflect on what it means for Mary to be the Mother of God, when we ponder her importance in the life of the Church, she brings us back to her Son, the focal point of today’s readings, the focal point of Salvation History, the focal point of the Church’s life.



Indeed, all of the Church’s doctrines pertaining to Mary, while they speak of Marian truths, actually emphasize a truth about Christ and bring us into a deeper understanding of who Christ is, and, we can be sure, that’s how Mary would want it to be. After all, when the angel declared to Mary that she would conceive the Lord and she gave him her “yes,” she surrendered her will to the Father. She gave Him her life and became the first disciple — the first steward — living her life in complete selfless

service for the Lord.

Her title, “Mother of God,” speaks of a profound truth about her Son. It tells us that, from the moment of His conception, Jesus Christ was fully God and fully man. It is a mystery and one we must believe as Catholics. And, today, as we honor Mary for her role in our salvation, we are called to ponder this mystery, to come to a deeper understanding of the reality of the incarnation.

We are also called as stewards to follow in Mary’s footsteps. She is the first disciple. And, as Christ’s disciple, she has given herself in service to Him. May we all follow suit. Like hers, may our lives be ones that proclaim Christ to others. Through what we say and do, through the sharing of our time, talent, and treasure, may we bring others closer to Christ, just as Mary does.

### MISSION CIRCLE

Our 2012 Epiphany Celebration will help the poorest of the poor – we are returning to Coachella, CA, on Jan. 8th to help the migrant worker families. Unemployment there is over 32% with annual incomes of \$8,000 to \$10,000 – well below the poverty level. We are collecting new shoes and clothes for as many as 1,000 kids. We wish we could include candy and toys but these children lack even the most basic clothing. We're asking for new sneakers, sweat suits, and jackets for kids 4 to 14 and warm baby clothes for infants and toddlers. Warm blankets and toiletries are also needed.

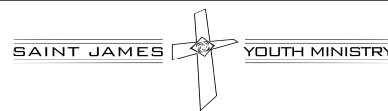

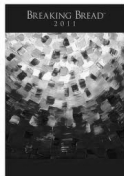

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

On this feast, we can see how devotion to Mary has been a beacon of hope to the sick throughout history. In the new cathedral of Los Angeles, the faithful enter through a single door topped by a striking sculpture of Mary with arms stretched down in compassion. Sculpted into the massive bronze doors are the titles of Mary most treasured by various cultures. Many of them speak of how the sick are consoled by a sense of Mary's presence.

Dorothy Day once recalled St. Bonaventure's remark that after the Lord's long forty days of fasting in the desert, when he was diminished and weak from his struggle, the angels who ministered to him went first to the Blessed Mother's house. There they saw the soup that was on her stove, and took some to the Lord so that he would delight in it even more since his mother had prepared it. "Of course," said Dorothy Day matter-of-factly.

In praying the rosary and savoring the stories of Mary's steadfast love in the face of all suffering, the sick are strengthened by one of our tradition's most shining treasures, and the whole Church is enriched.

## REFLECTION DOMINICAL

Es interesante que hoy en día, un día en que celebramos la fiesta de María, la Madre de Dios, poco se dice acerca de María en las lecturas. María juega un papel vital en la historia de la salvación, y hoy celebramos una parte clave de ese papel. Sin embargo, cuando reflexionamos sobre lo que significa para María para ser la Madre de Dios, cuando reflexionamos sobre su importancia en la vida de la Iglesia, que nos lleva de nuevo a su Hijo, el punto focal de las lecturas de hoy, el punto focal de la historia de la salvación, el punto focal de la vida de la Iglesia.

De hecho, todas las doctrinas de la Iglesia relativos a María, mientras hablan de las verdades marianas, de hecho hincapié en una verdad acerca de Cristo y nos lleve a una comprensión más profunda de quién es Cristo, y, podemos estar seguros, así es como María, que quiere que se. Después de todo, cuando el ángel anunció a María que concebiría al Señor y le dio su "sí", se rindió ella la voluntad del Padre. Ella le dio su vida y se convirtió en el primer discípulo - el mayor domo primero - que viven su vida al servicio desinteresado completo para el Señor.

Su título, "Madre de Dios," habla de una profunda verdad acerca de su Hijo. Se nos dice que, desde el momento de su concepción, Jesús era totalmente Dios y totalmente hombre. Es un misterio y una que debemos creer como católicos. Y, hoy, al honrar a María por su papel en nuestra salvación, se nos llama a reflexionar sobre este misterio, para llegar a una comprensión más profunda de la realidad de la encarnación.

Nosotros también estamos llamados como administradores a seguir los pasos de María. Ella es la primera discípula. Y, como discípulo de Cristo, se ha entregado al servicio de él. Que todos podamos seguir traje. Como la suya, puede que nuestras vidas sean las que anunciar a Cristo a los demás. A través de lo que decimos y hacemos, a través de la puesta en común de nuestro tiempo, talento y tesoro, podemos acercar a otros a Cristo, como hace María.
