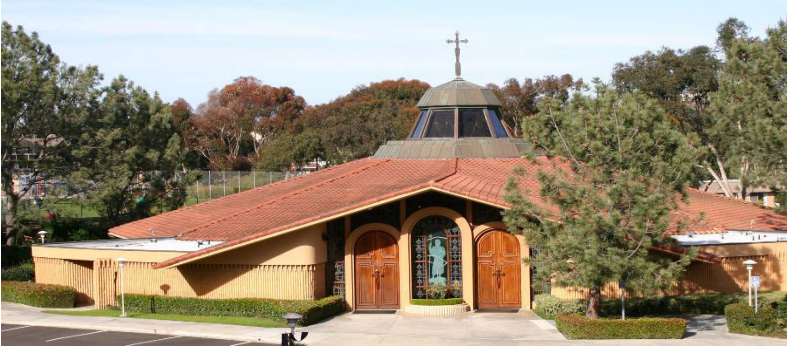

Called to be Holy

With this Sunday we begin Ordinary Time. The readings tell us about God's relationship with Israel and John the Baptist's relationship with Jesus. Israel's relationship with God is so close, so intimate, that it is through Israel that God's "salvation [will] reach to the ends of the earth" (Isaiah 49:6). But we know from John the Baptist that for Israel to accomplish God's will, it must also recognize that Jesus is the Son of God. During these weeks we also get to know Jesus. We begin to understand more deeply our relationship to Jesus and what that relationship means for us, who are "called to be holy" (1 Corinthians 1:2).

First Reading — The glory of the Lord shows through Israel, a light to all nations, that salvation may reach to the ends of the earth (Isaiah 49:3, 5-6).

Psalm — Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will (Psalm 40).

Second Reading — All those who call upon the name of the Lord are called to be holy (1 Corinthians 1:1-3).

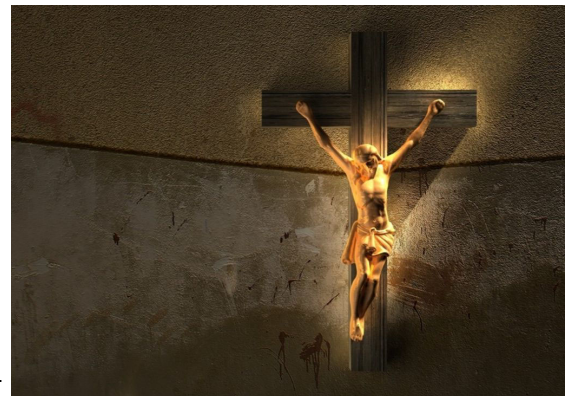
Gospel — John the Baptist testifies: The one who comes after me, on whom the Spirit comes down and remains, is the Son of God (John 1:29-34).

At the beginning of his first letter to the Corinthian Church, St. Paul addresses the members there as "you who have been sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be holy." The translation used in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* reads, "called to be saints." We may not think that we who are ordinary Christians are called to be saints—that's for special people, we say—but the Church teaches that's exactly what we should aim for. Vatican II wrote about the "universal call to holiness in the Church," a call that extends to the laity as well as the clergy and religious.

Of course, we cannot become saints by our own efforts, for we need God's grace and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. However, we also have to respond and cooperate with God's work in our lives. **Stewardship**—how we use the time, talent and treasure entrusted to us—both reflects and strengthens our cooperation with grace and so helps us accomplish God's plan for our life, namely, to become a saint.

Feast of Faith - The Greeting

At several points during the liturgy, the presider greets us with the words, "The Lord be with you." These simple words are not like the greetings that we exchange all day long—our "good mornings," our "hellos" and "how are yous." This liturgical greeting has roots deep in the Old Testament. In the book of Ruth, the words "the Lord be with you" are spoken by Boaz to the harvesters who are laboring in his fields (2:4); in the book of Judges, an angel speaks similar words to Gideon (6:12), where they are words of promise: for soon Gideon will lead his oppressed people to victory and freedom. For us, the words become a greeting of peace, a prayer that the Lord will indeed be with us, and a reminder of his promise to be with us always, to the end of the world (Matthew 28:20). Our response—"And also with you," soon to be "And with your spirit"—returns to the presider this prayer for the Lord's presence. As we know from the scriptures, a prayer for the Lord's presence is no small thing, for when God comes in our midst, God brings healing, grace, and challenge. God's presence transforms us.



In the 1940s, Antoine de Saint Exupéry wrote a famous children's story, *The Little Prince*. The Little Prince inhabits a small asteroid, where he spends his time devotedly caring for one beautiful rose.
