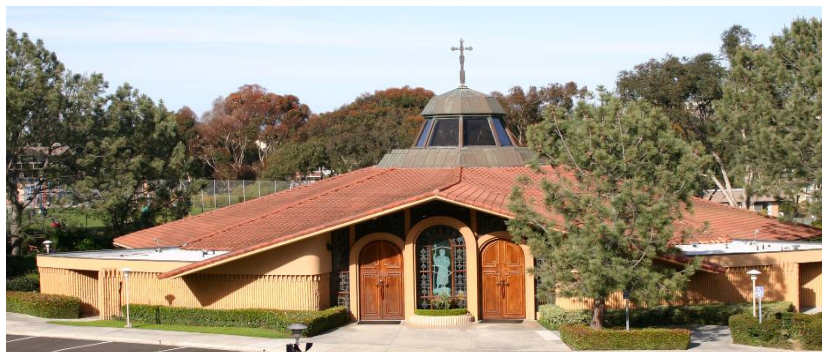

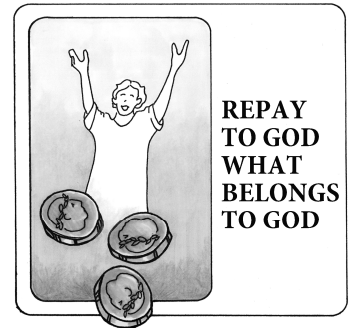

**STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION**

People who think they're only serving themselves can actually be carrying out God's will despite themselves. So it was with Cyrus the Great, the Persian emperor. His military conquests were for his glory, he thought, but the Lord used him to restore the Jews, the Chosen People, to their homes in Palestine. He allowed their return after he conquered the Babylonians, who had taken the Jews into captivity. Isaiah even referred to him as God's anointed, for he was serving God's purposes.



This reminds us that God is the one who gives authority to governments, as well as to the Church, and that each has its sphere of responsibility for our welfare. The problem is that governments often seek to expand their powers in ways that are tyrannical rather than beneficial. That's why the Church's witness is needed so that we can return to Caesar what is his, as well as return to God what is God's.

But it also means that as stewards we are responsible to share our gifts and serve the wider community beyond the parish wall as well as worship and serve within the Church. Both are needed for a healthy society. God's care extends to all aspects of our human life.

**SEVEN SECRETS OF SUCCESSFUL STEWARDS**

Authentic Catholic spirituality should always lead us in the direction of being a "disciple in mission." This means using all that God has given us to serve Jesus Christ and the Church. By God's grace, God redeems not only our sinful nature, but He redeems all we have including our time, talent and treasure. You can't get any more spiritual than when God's redeeming love transforms your time, talent and treasure into something beautiful for God and His Church.

**The Seven Secrets of Successful Stewards are:**

1. Give until it feels good;
2. See not obligation, but opportunity;
3. Give to specifics;
4. Have an attitude of gratitude;
5. Share various gifts at the right times;
6. Realize God will point the way;
7. See stewardship as a spiritual act.



Following Jesus always demands some sort of sacrifice on our part. Catholic Stewardship embraces this sacrifice and sees it as good since we are responding to God's call to love and serve Him in the Church.

**WORLD MISSION SUNDAY**

On October 23, 2011, the church will observe **World Mission Sunday**. The theme for this year's World Mission Sunday is **"As the Father has sent me, so I send you"** (Jn 20:21). This universal celebration serves to reawaken and promote awareness of the Church's missionary call.



During October, please pray that the Holy Spirit will enkindle in our hearts a true passion for evangelization and support of missionary activity and economic aid to the poorest Churches. "May World Mission Day reawaken in each of us the joy and desire to "go" out to meet humanity, taking Christ to all" (From the Vatican, 6 January 2011, the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. Benedictus PP XVI).

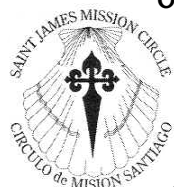

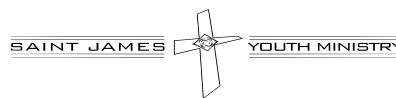

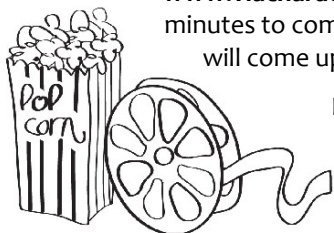

As you may know, on December 17, 2010, the President signed into law *The Tax Relief, Unemployment Insurance Reauthorization & Job Creation Act of 2010*. Highlights include extension of the charitable IRA rollover through December 31, 2011. A special provision allows certain donors to make charitable gift distributions. If you are 70 ½ years or older, the extended legislation allows you to make tax free gifts to qualified charitable organizations such as St. James and St. Leo Catholic Community by making direct transfers from your traditional or Roth IRA. (Please note that this legislation does not include IRA transfers to charitable trusts, donor advised trusts, charitable gift annuities or supporting organizations).

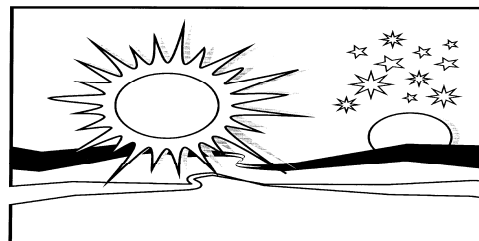
El pensó, que sus conquistas militares fueron para su gloria, pero el Señor lo utilizó para restaurar a los judíos, el pueblo escogido, sus casas en Palestina. Permitió su regreso después de que los conquistaran los babilonios, pues habían tomado a los judíos en el cautiverio. Isaías se refirió aún a él como un ungido de Dios, puesto que servía los propósitos de Dios.

Esto nos recuerda que Dios es el que da la autoridad a los gobiernos, así como a la Iglesia, y que cada uno tiene su esfera de responsabilidad para nuestro bienestar. El problema es que los gobiernos a menudo procuran expandir sus poderes de manera tiránica mas bien que hacer un beneficio. Por eso el que pertenece a la Iglesia necesita regresar al César lo que es el suyo, así como se regresa a Dios lo que es Dios.

Pero también significa que como administradores somos responsables de compartir nuestros regalos y servir la comunidad más ampliamente más allá de la pared de la parroquia así como en el culto y servir dentro de la Iglesia. Ambos están necesitados para una sociedad sana. El cuidado de Dios se extiende a todos los aspectos de nuestra vida humana.
