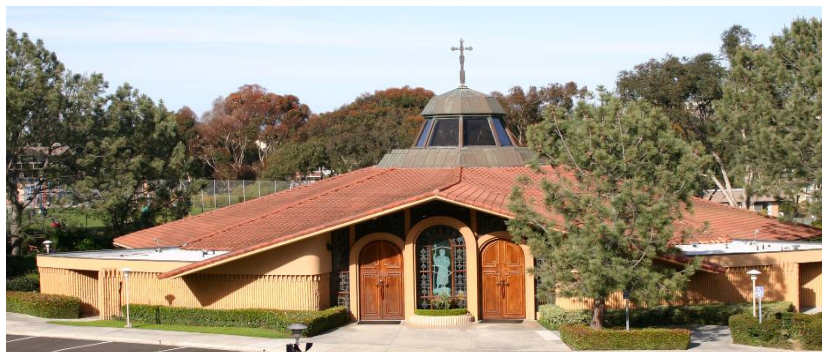

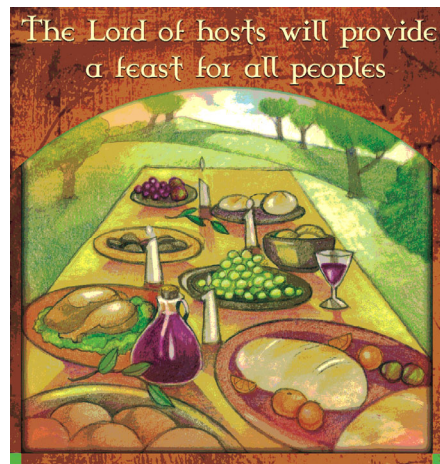

GOD REVEALED TO THE NATIONS

What wonderful images we have today of the reign of God! Isaiah speaks to us of a great feast—a heavenly feast—a feast of abundance with rich foods and choice wines. It is the Lord's own affair, Isaiah explains, when God will unite all nations, dry every tear, and destroy death forever. Then, too, will the entire earth rejoice in the Lord and bask in God's saving grace. Jesus speaks of heaven in terms of a feast as well. Here, the kingdom of heaven is likened to a king's wedding feast given for his son. This is a feast of abundance also, with the fattened cattle prepared just so. But many of the people invited don't want to come, so the king invites anyone who would honor his son by their presence there. And Paul tells us that whether we live abundantly or in humble circumstances, we can do all things in the Lord who strengthens us.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

It often seems that everything is against us. The universe is vast, and society is complex. No one seems to care what we want. Part of that feeling is because we are creatures, and therefore limited. But part of this is the result of original sin, which causes us to want to make ourselves the center of the world, and we view every desire as a genuine need.

St. Paul, however, wrote to the Philippians that he had learned to be content whether he had abundance or was hungry. In fact, he could even write, “My God will fully supply whatever you need, in accord with his glorious riches in Christ Jesus.” His trust in the Lord was not some sort of lofty sentiment expressed in comfort. No, he wrote this while a prisoner in a miserable Roman jail.

When we have learned to view the world as St. Paul did, from the perspective of trust in God, it changes the way we view the gifts of time, talent, and treasure we have received, and we want to use them for God’s glory and the service of others. Then we’ll experience the Messianic banquet of which the Eucharist is the foretaste and accept Jesus’ invitation, the only invitation that really matters.



USING OUR GIFTS FOR GOD’S PURPOSES

Everything should be used for God’s purposes. Everything we have is God’s gift to us, and so it makes sense to say that everything should be used for God’s purposes. Next month, as a nation, we will celebrate Thanksgiving Day. Even in the midst of all the problems we personally face in our daily lives, and amidst all the problems we are facing as a nation, we all have a great deal to be thankful to God. This time of renewal is a good time to reflect on God’s goodness to us and to realize just how blessed we are. With such great blessings comes a great responsibility to share what we have with others, to use what we have for God’s purposes. Ultimately, that is what the stewardship way of life is all about.



COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED

All Souls Day, Wednesday, November 2nd, commemorates all those who have died and who, we pray, may one day join the saints around the great banquet table of the Lamb. We pray for the dead. 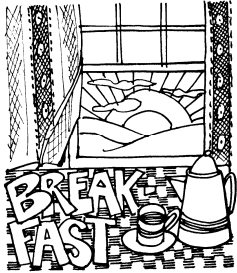

A menudo parece que todo está contra nosotros. El universo es vasto, y la sociedad es compleja. Nadie parece cuidar lo que deseamos. Parte de ese sentirse es porque somos criaturas, y por lo tanto limitados. Pero parte de esto es el resultado del pecado original, que causa que queramos hacernos el centro del mundo, y nosotros vemos cada deseo como una verdadera necesidad.

San Pablo escribió sin embargo a los Filipenses que había aprendido a estar contento tanto en la abundancia como en la carencia. De hecho, él aún podría escribir, "Mi Dios suministrará completamente lo que necesitamos, de acuerdo con su riqueza gloriosa en Jesucristo". Su confianza en el Señor no fue un tipo de sentimiento majestuoso expresado en el consuelo. No, escribió esto mientras estaba preso en una cárcel miserable romana

Cuando hemos aprendido a ver el mundo como San Pablo lo hizo, desde la perspectiva de confianza en Dios, cambia la manera como vemos y estimamos los regalos del **tiempo, talento, y tesoro** queremos utilizarlos para la gloria de Dios y el servicio de los

demás. Entonces experimentaremos el banquete Mesiánico de que la Eucaristía es el anticipo y aceptamos la invitación de Jesús, la única invitación que importa realmente.
