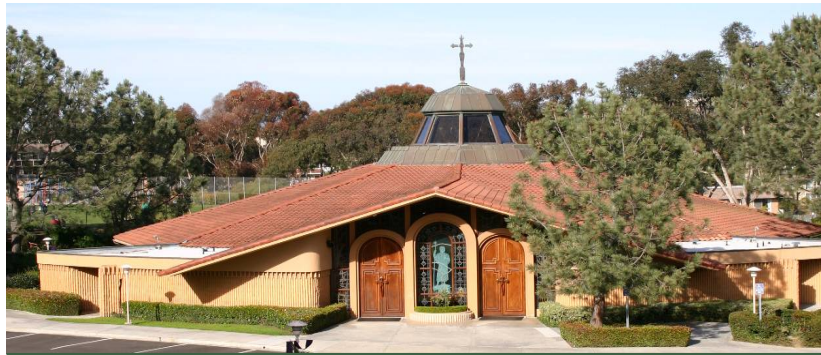

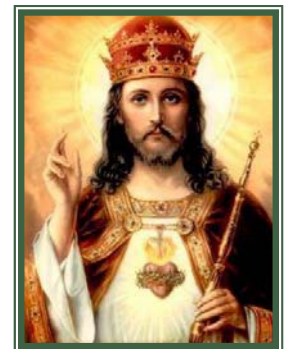

## THE SHEPHERD KING

The job of shepherd and the job of king couldn't be more different from each other. Shepherds are on the lowest rung of society, kings are at the top. But God says, through the prophet Ezekiel, that the Messiah will lead in a way very different from earthly authorities who lord it over their people and cause harm with their poor leadership.

Our King takes on the job himself. Christ, like a shepherd, will give rest, seek out the lost, bring back the strayed and scattered ones. He will heal the wounded and bind up the injured. He does not delegate, but will "shepherd them rightly." We have a king who cares for us and who is not afraid to "judge between one sheep and another." (Ezekiel 34:17).

**STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION**

**T**oday we celebrate the feast of Christ the King. And while Christ is King of the World, he is also a kind and loving shepherd who cares for His flock.

The first reading today focuses on the Lord’s caring nature. “I will rescue them from every place where they were scattered when it was cloudy and dark. I myself will give them rest.”

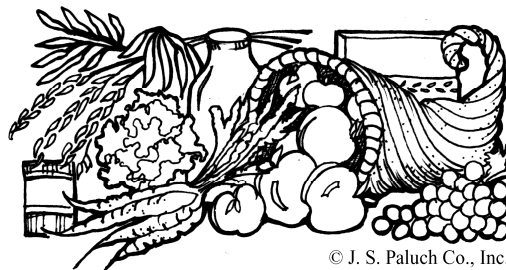
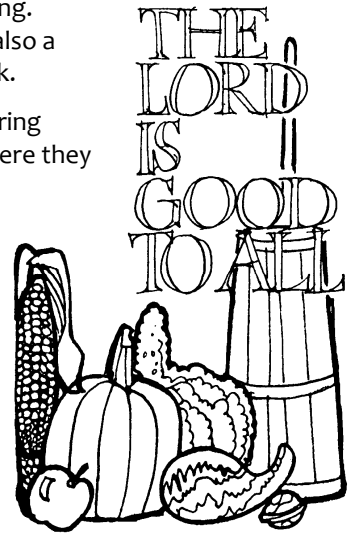
The Responsorial Psalm reiterates those sentiments, praising the Lord for His incredible generosity. He gives us all we need and more, again, like a shepherd who cares for His sheep.

Meanwhile, in all three of the readings, there is an eschatological element. Each one, in varying degrees, speaks to us of the second coming and the final judgment that will take place when the Lord does return in glory.

The Lord is our shepherd. It is, therefore, our responsibility as His disciples to use what He has given us wisely. We all have time, talents and treasure, and we are called to use those gifts to the best of our ability, not by squandering them, but by taking ownership of them and making the Master proud.

On judgment day, the faithful steward of God’s gifts will be with those on the right, and with the words, “Come, you are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world,” we will be ushered into the heavenly kingdom.

## REFLEXION DOMINICAL

Hoy celebramos la fiesta de Cristo el Rey. Y mientras que Cristo es Rey del Mundo, él es también un modelo y pastor amoroso que cuida de su rebaño.

La primera lectura se centra hoy en la naturaleza del cuidado del Señor. "Los rescataré de cada lugar donde fueron dispersados cuando estuvo nublado y oscuro.

Yo mismo les daré descanso". El Salmo Responsorial reitera esos sentimientos, alabando al Señor por su increíble generosidad. Nos da todo lo que necesitamos y más, otra vez, como un pastor que cuida de sus ovejas.

Mientras tanto, en las tres lecturas, hay un elemento escatológico. Cada uno de ellos, en mayor o menor grados, nos habla de la segunda venida y el juicio final que sucederán cuando el Señor regresa en gloria.

El Señor es nuestro pastor. Es, por lo tanto, nuestra responsabilidad igual que a sus discípulos utilizar lo que nos ha dado sabiamente. Todos tenemos **tiempo, talentos y tesoro** y estamos llamados a utilizar esos regalos con lo mejor de nuestra capacidad, no derrochándolos, sino tomando responsabilidad de ellos y ser el orgullo del nuestro Rey.

En el día del juicio final, el administrador fiel de los regalos de Dios estará con ellos a la derecha, y con las palabras, "Ven, bendito por mi Padre. Hereda el reino preparado para ti desde el principio del mundo," seremos introducidos en el reino celestial.
