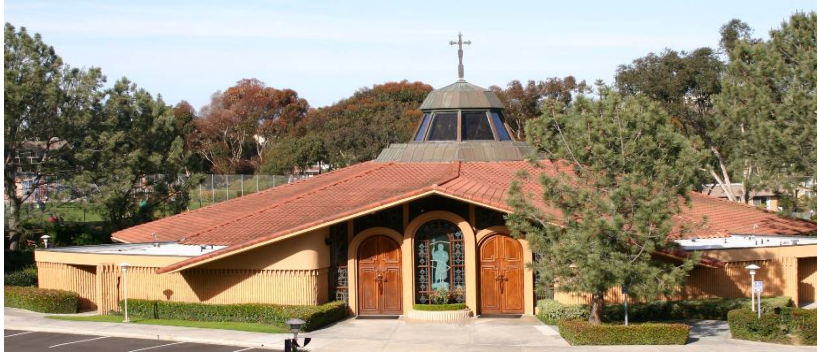

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

What would you say is the oldest, most frequently sung, most translated, most memorized, most beloved song text in the Christian world today? An astute and surprising answer might be the *Gloria*, "Glory to God in the Highest." In three weeks' time, the Lenten fast will begin, and the *Gloria*, sung at the beginning of Sunday Mass, will be silenced. It is an heirloom from a treasury of hymns spun from the songs of praise on the lips of Mary, Elizabeth, and Zachary. We move in the prayer from the song of the angels at the first Christmas, to the praise of God, and to a final plea to Christ to continue and complete his work in us.

For nearly 1500 years, the singing of the *Gloria* has been a sign of the festive quality of a particular Mass. From the beginning it was a song of the people, not of the choir or clergy. These last few Sundays of winter Ordinary Time allow us a chance to savor the hymn and give ourselves over to the chorus. How is the song of praise arising from your pew? If you claim the song as yours, its absence from Lent will be more striking, and its return at Easter will cheer your heart.

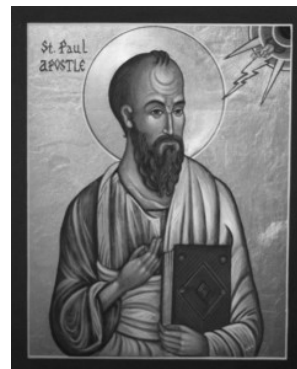

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

“Do everything for the glory of God,” Paul tells the Corinthians in today’s second reading.

Indeed, we are all charged with that same task. As Christian disciples, we are called to live in such a way that all we do and say gives glory to the Lord. We recognize that He is the one who has given us the many good gifts we enjoy – our time, our talents, and our treasure. Even our very lives come by way of gift from God, and it is our duty as His disciples to use the many gifts He has given us in such a way that we bear witness to Him.



It is not an easy task, particularly in the world in which we live. We are surrounded by so much relativistic thinking, and engulfed in a culture of selfishness. The secular society tells us that what “I” want to do and when “I” want to do it is all that matters. Yet, we know that there is so much beyond our “here and now” life on Earth. There is so much beyond the “feel-good” mentality of our culture. We are here to know, love, and to serve God, and when we do so, all who come in contact with us will see Christ.

It is a difficult task to be in the world but not of it, and to live for one person and one person only: the Lord. But we know that, when we do, we are richly rewarded. The life of a Christian disciple isn’t an easy one. In fact, just as the Corinthians to whom Paul writes this letter, we are sure to confront constant opposition, but when we live for Christ, giving Him glory in all we do – at home, at work, at school, and elsewhere, we are richly blessed.

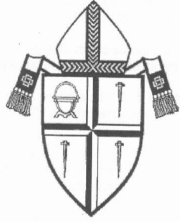

A letter from the Bishop

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

I write to you concerning a serious matter that negatively impacts the Church in the United States and strikes at the fundamental right to religious liberty for citizens of any faith. The federal government has just dealt a heavy blow not only to Catholics but to millions more who are served by the Catholic faithful.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services announced last week that almost all employers, including Catholic employers, will be forced to provide employees' health coverage that will include contraception, sterilization, and abortion-inducing drugs. Nearly all health insurers will be forced to include these "services," and nearly everyone will be forced to buy that coverage. As a result, in the Diocese of San Diego, this will impact institutions such as Catholic Charities, Father Joe's Villages, and our diocesan Catholic Schools.

In so ruling, the Obama Administration is denying to Catholics the fundamental freedom of religious liberty guaranteed by the First Amendment to the Constitution of the United States. Unless the rule is overturned, we will be compelled either to violate our consciences or to drop health coverage for our employees and thus suffer severe penalties. We cannot comply with this unjust law.

I would ask of you two things. First, as a community of faith we must commit ourselves to prayer and fasting, so that wisdom may prevail and religious liberty be restored. Second, please visit the USCCB web site, www.usccb.org/conscience, to learn more about this assault on religious liberty and to join others in contacting Congress in support of legislation that would reverse the Obama Administration's decision.

I thank you for your prayers, sacrifice, and advocacy on behalf of protecting religious liberties.

Estimados hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Les escribo por razón de un asunto serio que afecta negativamente a la Iglesia en los Estados Unidos, y que atenta contra el derecho fundamental a la libertad religiosa de todos los ciudadanos de cualquier credo. El gobierno federal acaba de dar un duro golpe no solo a la población católica sino que a millones de personas a quienes los fieles católicos proporcionan sus servicios.

El Departamento de Salud y Servicios Humanos de los Estados Unidos anunció la semana pasada que casi todos los empleadores, incluyendo los católicos, estarán obligados a ofrecer en la cobertura médica de sus empleados los anticonceptivos, la esterilización, y drogas que inducen abortos. Casi todos las entidades que ofrecen seguro médico a sus empleados serán forzados a incluir esos "servicios" y todos estaremos obligados a comprar esa cobertura como parte de la póliza. Como consecuencia en la Diócesis de San Diego, esto afectará a instituciones como Caridades Católicas, Father Joe's Villages y a todas nuestras escuelas católicas.

Con esta decisión, la Administración del Presidente Obama esta negando a los católicos el derecho fundamental de la libertad religiosa garantizado por la Primera Enmienda de la Constitución de los Estados Unidos. A menos que la regulación sea anulada, nos veremos obligados a violar nuestra conciencia o a dejar de ofrecer seguro médico a nuestros empleados y además sufrir sanciones económicas severas por ello. No podemos cumplir con esta ley injusta.

Por lo tanto, les pido dos cosas. Primero, que como comunidad de fe nos comprometamos a orar y ayunar para que la sabiduría y la justicia prevalezcan, y la libertad religiosa sea restaurada. En segundo lugar, por favor visiten el sitio web del USCCB www.usccb.org/conscience para aprender más sobre esta violación a la libertad religiosa, y unirse a otros para pedirle al Congreso que apoye la legislación que revocaría la decisión de la administración del Presidente Obama.

Agradezco sus oraciones, sacrificios y abogacía para proteger la libertad religiosa.

REFLECTION DOMINICAL

"Hacedlo todo por la gloria de Dios", Pablo les dice a los Corintios en la segunda lectura de hoy.

De hecho, todos estamos acusados de la misma tarea. Como discípulos de Cristo, estamos llamados a vivir de tal manera que todo lo que hacemos y decimos da gloria al Señor. Reconocemos que Él es el que nos ha dado los muchos dones que disfrutamos buenos, nuestro tiempo, nuestros talentos y nuestro tesoro. Incluso nuestras propias vidas a cabo por medio del don de Dios, y es nuestro deber como sus discípulos a usar los dones que Él nos ha dado de tal manera que dan testimonio de él.

No es una tarea fácil, sobre todo en el mundo en que vivimos. Estamos rodeados de pensamiento relativista tanto, y envuelto en una cultura del egoísmo. La sociedad secular nos dice que lo "que" quieren hacer y cuando "yo" quiero hacer es lo que importa. Sin embargo, sabemos que hay mucho más allá de nuestro "aquí y ahora" la vida en la Tierra. Hay mucho más allá del "sentirse bien" la mentalidad de nuestra cultura. Estamos aquí para conocer, amar y servir a Dios, y cuando lo hacemos, todos los que entran en contacto con nosotros a ver a Cristo.

Es una tarea difícil estar en el mundo pero no de ella, y vivir para una persona y una sola persona: el Señor. Pero sabemos que, cuando lo hacemos, son generosamente recompensados. La vida de un discípulo cristiano no es fácil. De hecho, al igual que los corintios, a los que Pablo escribe esta carta, estamos seguros de hacer frente a la oposición constante, pero cuando vivimos para Cristo, dándole la gloria en todo lo que hacemos - en casa, en el trabajo, en la escuela, y en otros lugares, que son ricamente bendecido.
