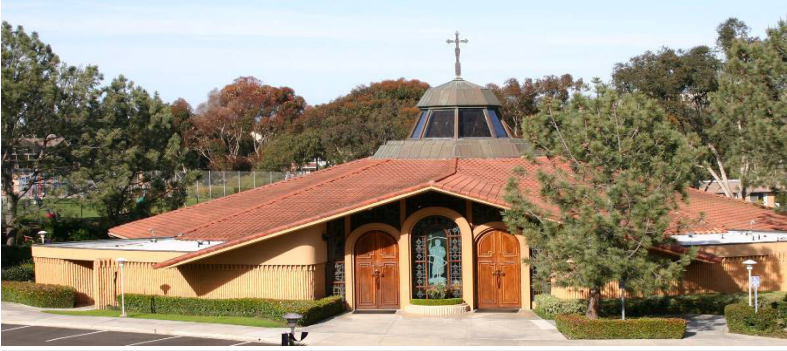

God's Call

The person who has been "saved," who has "heard the good news of salvation," still lives in an unsaved world, a world sadly oblivious to the presence of God. Today's readings outline how the disciple is present in the world.

The outline begins with Isaiah: "Share your bread . . . shelter the oppressed . . . clothe the naked" (Isaiah 58:7). Those who hear the word of salvation are not insensitive to the urgent needs of others. Then Paul reminds his flock that he brought Christ to them not in eloquence or wisdom, but by being with them in the "weakness and fear" of their daily lives (1 Corinthians 2:3). Finally, Jesus tells his disciples to go out into the gloom and darkness of the streets of the world and let God's light shine through their good deeds.

We disciples don't save the world. To the extent, however, that we have heard the word of God and been awakened to God's presence, we may spread that word and bring that presence to others.

We must do good deed, Jesus tells us, and do them for the glory of God. What sort of good deeds? Those enumerated by the prophet Isaiah give us some idea of what we're called upon to do: "Feed the hungry...shelter the homeless...clothe the naked." But we must do these good deeds in such a way that it's clear we're doing them so that God receives the glory and not ourselves. It takes an offering of time in prayer and worship, depending upon "the power of God" as St. Paul wrote, to grow spiritually enough to want to spend ourselves serving others and to want God to receive the praise. And it takes gifts of treasure and talent to provide the resources others need. Doing the work of God can take all we have to offer, but he will reward us with the spiritual light of his presence. But in his name we are salt and light, so we can make a difference in the world.

Feast of Faith - The Gloria (1)

The Gloria, or Glory to God, follows the penitential rite. Both are acts of praise. In the penitential rite, we sing of the mercy of Christ. In the Gloria we praise God's saving action in the universe.

The Gloria is a relatively late addition to the Mass. It first appeared in the Roman liturgy in the sixth century, and then it was sung only by the pope—and only on Christmas! With time, the hymn came to be sung by bishops on major feasts, and then by priests; finally, it became the song of the entire assembly. With the advent of more elaborate musical settings, the people gradually stopped singing the Gloria, until this song of the people became the exclusive domain of the priest and the choir. But the liturgical reforms have restored it to its place as primarily the song of the assembly.

The language of the Gloria echoes the New Testament canticles. It may be begun by the priest, the cantor, and the entire assembly in varied combinations. The Gloria is sometimes called the "greater doxology," and in some ways it is like an extended, ecstatic version of the familiar doxology ("Glory be to the Father") prayed in the Divine Office and the rosary.

Back to Basics

In today's Gospel, Jesus says we are salt and light only when we put ourselves to good and useful purposes. In ancient times salt was valuable as seasoning, to preserve foods, and disinfect wounds. Salt signified permanence, loyalty, and commitment. In those days salt crystals contained other minerals and the salt could easily leach out. What remained was useful only for keeping footpaths free of vegetation, as Jesus says, "no longer good for anything but to be . . . trampled underfoot" (Matthew 5:13). In Jesus' time, houses were lit with oil lamps. Even one small oil lamp would have seemed very bright in the darkness, and a reminder of God as the creator of light. The prophet Isaiah tells us how to be light and salt: "Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless; clothe the naked . . . and do not turn your back on your own" (Isaiah 58:7). Your good deeds, says Jesus, will be the light causing others to "glorify your heavenly Father" (Matthew 5:16).

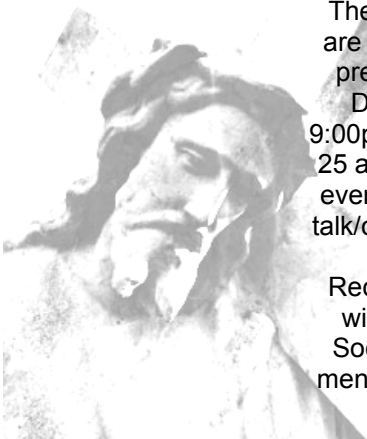

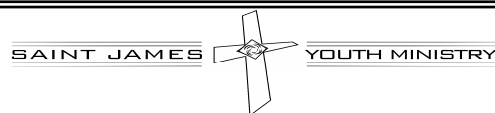
