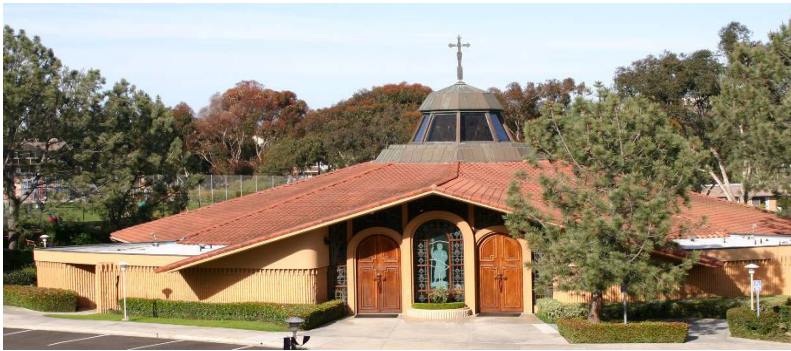

First Sunday of Lent - March 13, 2011

Today's Readings

First Reading — The man and the woman ate the fruit of the one tree that God had told them to avoid, and their shame overtook them (Genesis 2:7-9; 3:1-7).

Psalm — Be merciful, O Lord, for we have sinned (Psalm 51).

Second Reading — Death reigned from Adam to Moses, but now grace and life abound in Christ Jesus (Romans 5:12-19 [12, 17-19]).

Gospel — Jesus was led into the desert by the Spirit and there he fasted for forty days and forty nights (Matthew 4:1-11).

Strength Against Temptation

The first Sunday of the season of Lent always includes a Gospel account of the temptation of the Lord Jesus in the desert by the devil. This year, the story is set against the backdrop of the first reading from Genesis, which recounts the very first temptation by the devil. That story is set in a garden of delight. The Gospel story is set in the desert. As believers, we know that temptation comes our way in our own gardens of delight as well as the deserts of our lives. As Lent begins, our attention is drawn to that temptation within each of us to become like God—we want control, power, and answers to all of life's difficult questions. As communities of faith, we are given this season of repentance so that we can join our hearts with others on the difficult journey of conversion. We look to God and to one another for strength against temptation.

Living Stewardship Now—A prayer for Lent:

“O Lord, who has mercy upon all, take away from me my sins, and mercifully kindle in me the fire of thy Holy Spirit. Take away from me the heart of stone, and give me a heart of flesh, a heart to love and adore Thee, a heart to delight in Thee, to follow and enjoy Thee, for Christ’s sake. Amen.” —Saint Ambrose of Milan (339–397)

We humans were called by God to be good stewards - and we blew it! That’s the sad tale recounted in the Scripture readings we hear today. Just two weeks ago, on the Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time, we heard St. Paul’s admonition to the Corinthians that one basic requirement of a steward is that he or she prove trustworthy (1 Cor 4:2), and on this First Sunday of Lent we find out how miserably we have failed to meet that test.


Adam and Eve couldn’t see into the future and yield to the temptation to gain an immediate satisfaction. And so, Adam proved to be a failure as a steward; he couldn’t be trusted to obey the one specific instruction he had been given.

In the Gospel, Jesus was also tempted. Being fully human as well as fully divine, He could of yielded to the temptation. But He proved faithful and successfully resisted the temptations.

Adam failed to be a trustworthy steward where Jesus succeeded when confronted by Satan. What about the rest of us?

St. Paul points to the contrasting results of the two events. Through the sin of Adam, his failure to be a trustworthy steward, death entered the world, with the result that we all die. But because of Jesus’ obedience, not only in the contest with Satan at the beginning of his public ministry, but throughout it, including the Agony in the Garden of Gethsemane and His Crucifixion, life has been restored to us, spiritual life with God beginning now and continuing into eternity.

This Lent, then, let us pray that we may use the grace, won for us by Christ’s sacrifice, to be trustworthy stewards, obeying God’s commands and using the gifts of time, talent, and treasure entrusted to us, not for our own sake, but to the glory of God and the benefit of all his people.

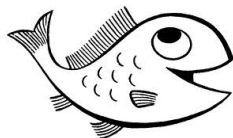

Please remember that this is a **reservation-only event**.

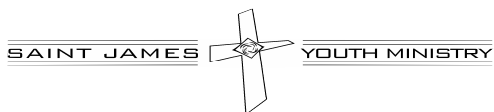

Healing Prayer at St. James

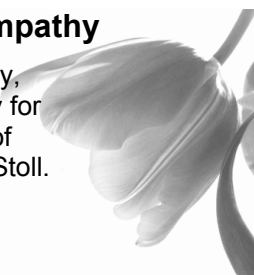

Frases del Papa Benedicto XVI ...**Para vivir la Cuaresma 2011**

1. Que en cada familia y comunidad cristiana **se valore la Cuaresma** para alejar todo lo que distrae el espíritu y para intensificar lo que alimenta el alma y la abre al amor de Dios y del prójimo. Pienso, especialmente, en un mayor empeño en la oración, en la lectio divina, en el Sacramento de la Reconciliación [la confesión] y en la activa participación en la Eucaristía, sobre todo en la Santa Misa dominical.
2. **El ayuno** es una gran ayuda para evitar el pecado y todo lo que induce a él.
3. El verdadero ayuno, repite en otra ocasión el divino Maestro, consiste más bien en **cumplir la voluntad del Padre celestial**, que “ve en lo secreto y te recompensará”
4. Si, por lo tanto, Adán desobedeció el orden del Señor de “no comer del árbol de la ciencia del bien y del mal”, con el ayuno el creyente **desea someterse humildemente a Dios, confiando en su bondad y misericordia.**
