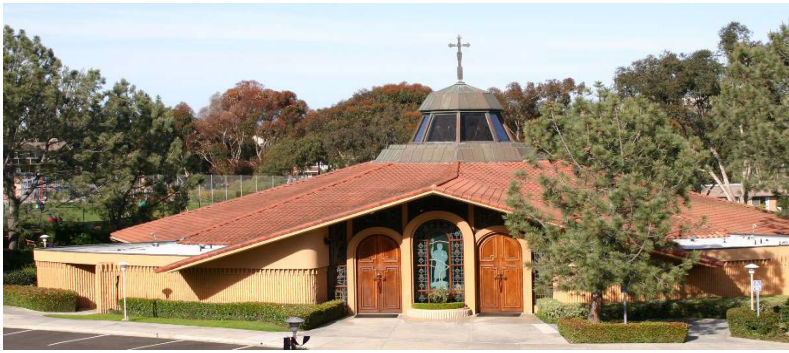

Stewardship Reflection

The Palm Sunday liturgy begins with Jesus' Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem. What a glorious event that must have been!

The Servant in the First Reading from Isaiah stated his obedience to the will of the Lord God. He spoke the words he was told to speak, and he suffered brutality from the wicked, because the Servant announced, "The Lord God is my help, therefore I am not disgraced.

In the Second Reading, God the Son we read, emptied himself from the glory he had in heaven to become human. He went farther than that — in obedience to the Father's will, he accepted death. That God would accept death to save sinful humans is almost inconceivable.

Jesus Christ, God the Son, did just that. Jesus was willing to undertake the Atonement, the restoration of friendly relations between humanity and God, by giving up his glory to become one of us, and even more, enduring humiliation, suffering, and finally death. He gave up everything for us, even his life.

What are you willing to give up for him in return? Most of us will not be asked to give up our earthly lives for the sake of the Kingdom, although some people do. It's been said that the 20th century saw more Christian martyrs than all the other centuries combined. The 21st century seems to have started alone the same route. So martyrdom is an unlikely but possible conclusion to your earthly life.

But if you're not asked to surrender our lives for Christ, what are you willing to offer him? What commitments of your *Time* are you willing to use for prayer, for worship, for reading the Bible? What use are you ready to make of the *Talent* entrusted to you for the sake of God's kingdom and helping his people? How much of the *Treasure* you have control of will you share for God's service?

We hear in the Passion Gospel read today how much God's love for us cost him. How much are we will to offer him in return?

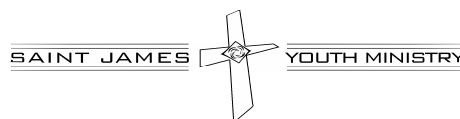

Domingo de Ramos

La liturgia del domingo de Ramos inicia con la entrada triunfal a Jerusalén. ¡Qué evento tan glorioso ha de haber sido.! El siervo en la primera lectura de Isaías estableció su obediencia a la voluntad de Dios. Habló las palabras que fueron dichas para denunciar y sufrió la brutalidad del malvado, porque el Siervo anunció, "El Señor Dios me ayuda, para que no sea insultado." En la Segunda lectura, leemos, que Dios, el Hijo, se vació de la gloria que tuvo en el cielo y llegó a ser humano. Fue más lejos que eso conforme a la voluntad del Padre, él aceptó la muerte.

Que Dios aceptaría la muerte para salvar a la humanidad pecadora, es casi inconcebible. Jesucristo, El Hijo de Dios lo hizo. Jesús estuvo dispuesto a emprender la expiación, la restauración de las relaciones amistosas entre humanidad y Dios, por abandonar su gloria y llegar a ser uno para nosotros, y aún más, sufriendo una perdurable humillación y por último la muerte. Dió todo para nosotros, aún su vida.

¿Qué está dispuestos abandonar para cuando él regrese? A la mayor parte de nosotros no se nos pedirá que abandonemos nuestras vidas terrenales por el Reino, aunque algunas personas sí lo hagan. Se ha dicho que el siglo XX vio más mártires cristianos que todos los otros siglos combinados. El siglo XXI parece haber comenzado la misma ruta. Así el martirio es una conclusión improbable pero posible a su vida terrenal.

*¿Mas si a ustedes no les piden entregar sus vidas a Cristo, qué están dispuestos a ofrecerle? ¿Qué compromiso de su **Tiempo**, está usted dispuesto a utilizar para la oración, la adoración, leer la Biblia? ¿Qué uso está usted listo para hacer del **Talento** confiado a usted para el bien del Reino de Dios y ayudar a las personas? ¿Cuánta voluntad de controlar su **Tesoro** tiene para el servicio de Dios? Oímos en el Evangelio de la Pasión cuánto nos amó y le costamos a él. ¿Cuánto estamos dispuestos ofrecer y regresarle?*
