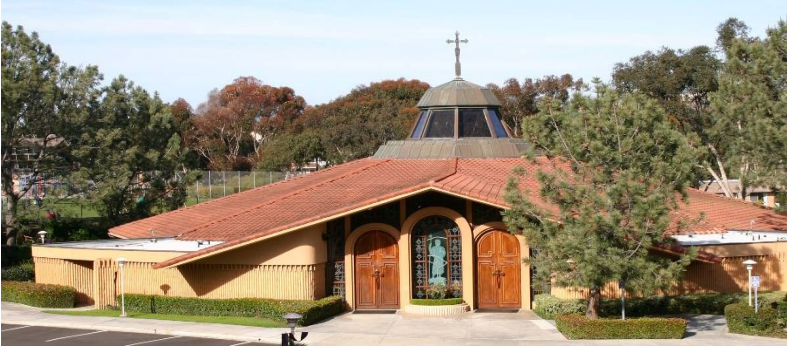

RESTORATION OF THE BELL

For decades the bronze bell rang out from St. Leo Mission tower as it joyfully proclaimed hundreds of celebrations and served to remind residents and parishioners of Christ's presence.

In 2004, the wooden bell tower was discovered to be termite ridden and had to be demolished. A group of parishioners from both churches are championing the restoration of the bell and the tower. In this Centennial year it seems a fitting tribute to those who struggled to establish the parish and participated in the life of the Church.

The bell was transported to St. James Church Patio of the Bells, for Bishop Brom's celebration of a **Centennial Mass on Saturday, July 23 at 5pm**, thanking God for all the blessings He has bestowed upon the St. James and St. Leo Catholic Community over the last 100 years. The bell was blessed as an official sign of our commitment to its restoration as an important part of our legacy.
