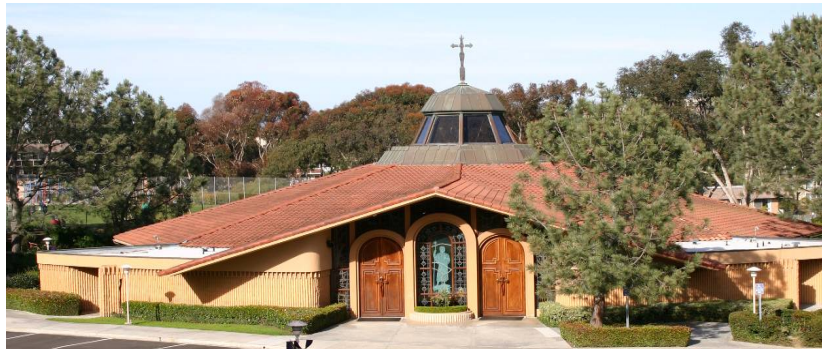

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

One of the freedoms God has given us is the freedom to change our minds. The two sons in Jesus’ parable exercised that freedom when their father asked them to work in his vineyard one day. The first son refused, but then changed his mind and went. The second agreed to work but never showed up. In the same way, the sinners who responded to the preaching of St. John the Baptist obeyed God when those religious leaders who seemed to be holy refused to actually do so, and so the repentant sinners were the ones who entered the Kingdom of God.

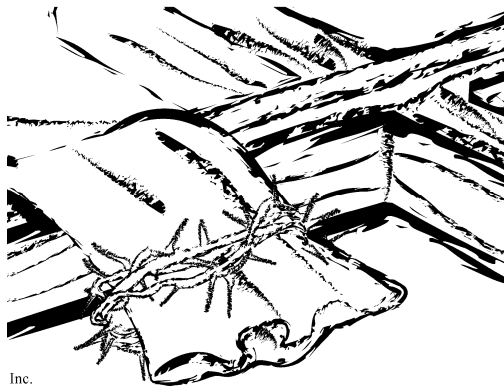


We Christians know we should do the will of God the Father, but we tend to be fickle and not follow through on our intention to obey God’s will. We need God’s grace to be constant and to help us develop “the same attitude that is also in Christ Jesus,” as St. Paul wrote to the Philippians. As Christ gave up the glory of heaven to die on our behalf, so we have a challenge: “Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves.”

If we accept that challenge, and change our minds from serving ourselves first, it will inevitably change the way we use the time, the talent, and the treasure entrusted to us.

PUT ON THE ATTITUDE OF CHRIST

Saint Augustine, a doctor of the church, once wrote that the first, second, and third most important attitude in Christianity is humility. In today’s second reading, Saint Paul is concerned with how we conduct ourselves in our community of faith. He urges us to let our conduct be worthy of the Gospel we say that we believe; and that it all begins with humility. *He asks us to consider others better than ourselves, and to serve them by looking out for their best interest, not ours.* Consider how Saint Paul’s appeal to imitating Christ’s humility can enhance our relationships.

REFLEXION DOMINICAL

Una de las libertades que Dios nos ha dado es la libertad de cambiar de opinión. Uno de los dos hijos en la parábola de Jesús ejerció esa libertad cuando su padre les pidió que trabajaran en su viña un día. El primer hijo se negó, pero entonces cambió de opinión y fue.

El segundo acordó en trabajar pero nunca apareció. De la misma manera, los pecadores que respondieron a la predicación de San Juan Bautista obedecieron a Dios cuando esos líderes religiosos parecieron ser santos se negaron a ser realmente así, y en cambio los pecadores arrepentidos fueron los que entraron el Reino de Dios.

Nosotros los cristianos sabemos que debemos hacer la voluntad de Dios Padre, pero tendemos a ser inconstantes y no seguimos el fin de nuestras intenciones para obedecer la voluntad de Dios. Necesitamos la gracia de Dios para ser constantes y para ayudarnos a desarrollar "la misma actitud que es también la de Jesucristo," como San Pablo escribió a los Filipenses.

Cristo abandonó la gloria del cielo para morir en nuestro beneficio, así tenemos un desafío: "No hacemos nada fuera del egoísmo o fuera de la vanagloria; más bien, consideremos humildemente a los demás como más importante que nosotros mismos".

Si aceptamos ese desafío, y cambiamos de opinión de servir primero, cambiará inevitablemente la manera que utilizamos el tiempo, el talento, y el tesoro confiado a nosotros.
